

Common seminars in GTG programme (3 ects)

During your master's studies you need to attend 15 seminars in one of which you'll give your own presentation. Credit points can also be collected from relevant seminars and academic dissertations at other schools and departments at the campus. Start participating in the seminars already at the beginning of your studies.

Toxicology seminars are the priority but you can attend also the seminars in other disciplines (pharmacology, biopharmacy, pharmaceutical chemistry, pharmaceutical technology).

How to keep the seminar list?

- There are participant lists in each seminar. Write your own name into the list.
- Keep your own list about the seminars which you have attended. When you have attended enough seminars, you can present your list to Päivi Mensalo who will register your credit points. You can collect the seminars in two parts, 1.5 ects (7 seminars) + 1.5 ects (7 seminars + own thesis seminar).

Keeping your own thesis seminar

- When you have agreed with your thesis supervisors on your own seminar, schedule the time with your supervisor (at least one supervisor has to be present in the seminar). Check also that during your own seminar time there is no teaching of your own subject going on.
- Book the time through e-mail: [tapahtumat-farmasia\(at\)uef.fi](mailto:tapahtumat-farmasia@uef.fi) --- inform the title of the thesis, names of supervisors and subject (general toxicology).
- Print out the [list of participants](#) and fulfil the sheet
- Circulate the list of participants in the seminar for the students to sign.
- Return the list of participants to the secretary of Pharmacy, room Ca3137/2.
- Length of the thesis seminar is 20 min + 10 min discussion.

Thesis seminar

You will present your project to your fellow students and researchers. You can keep your seminar when you have done the research and analyzed your data.

Schedule the time with your supervisor(s), at least one of the supervisors has to be present in the seminar. Remember that your supervisor will approve your seminar presentation before you can present it.
