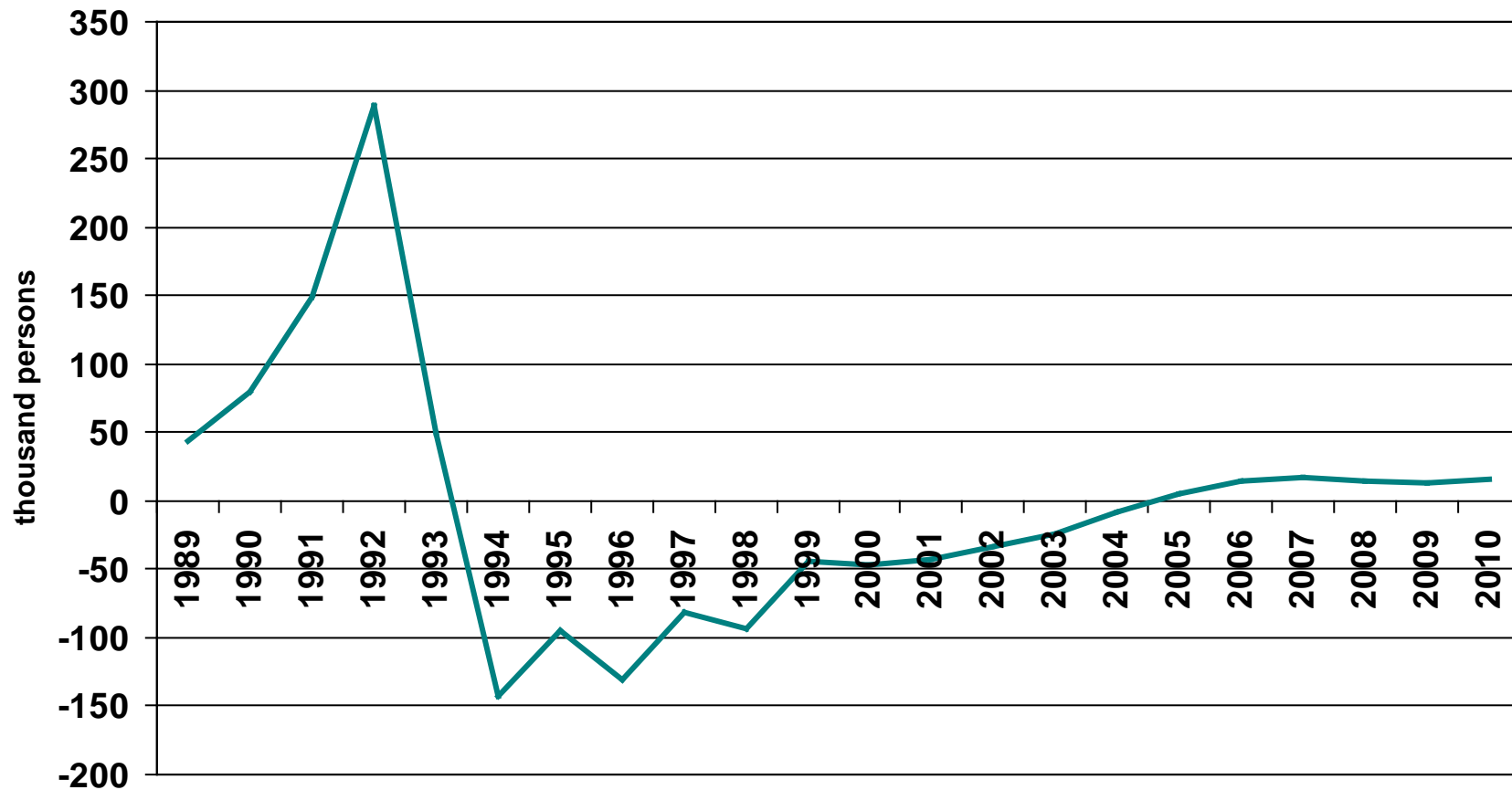
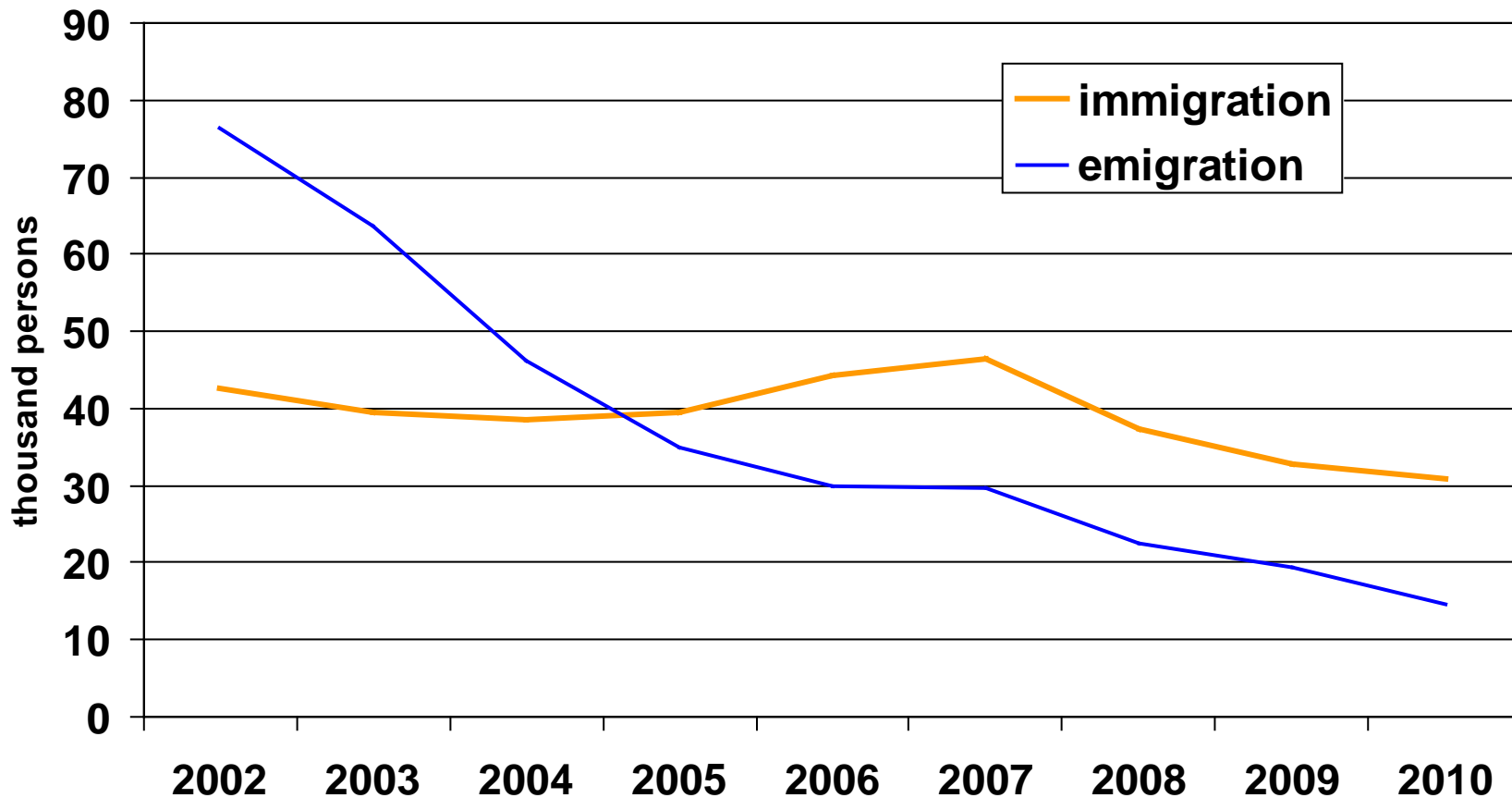


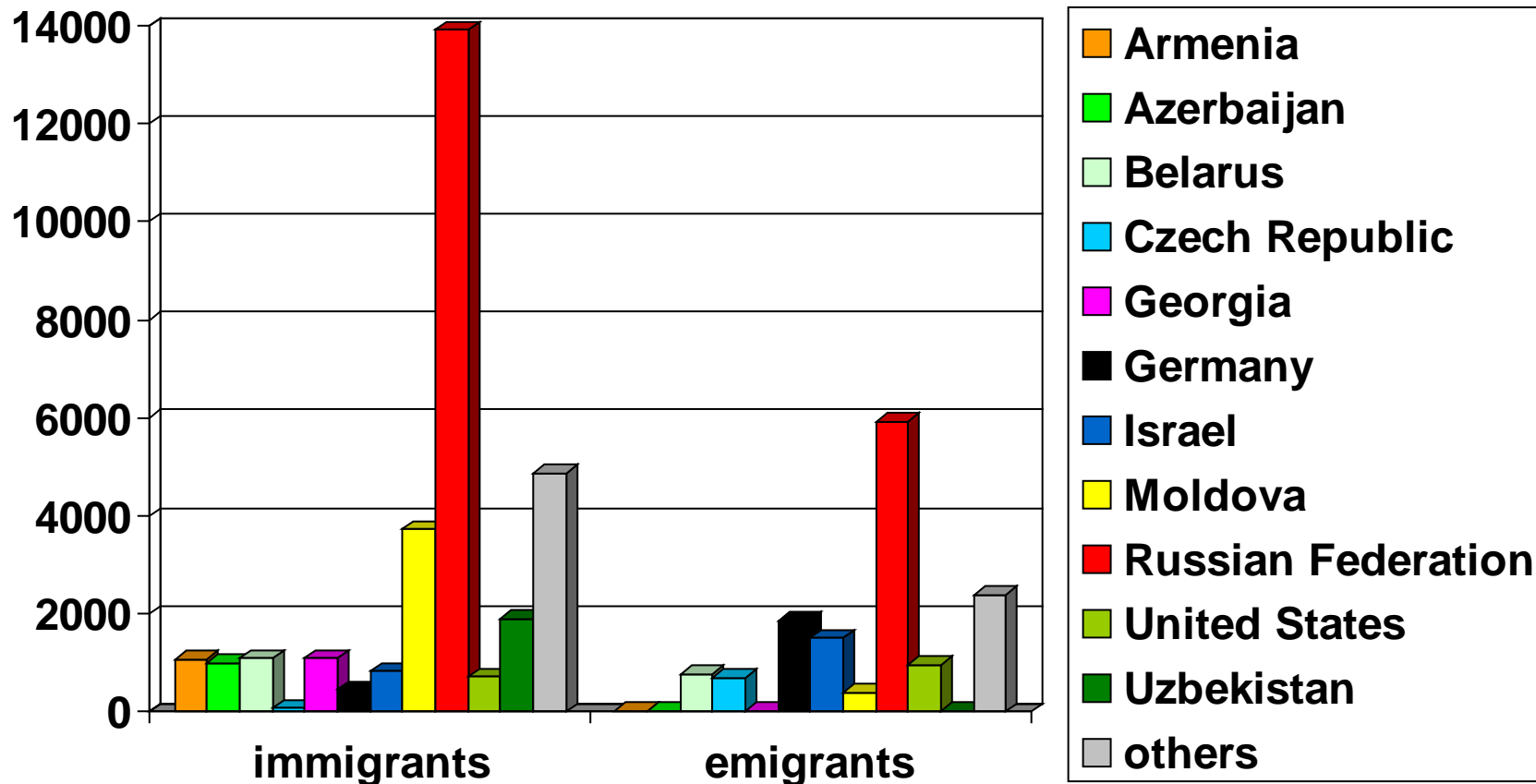
Dynamics of net migrations of the population of Ukraine in 1989-2010 (according to the current statistics)



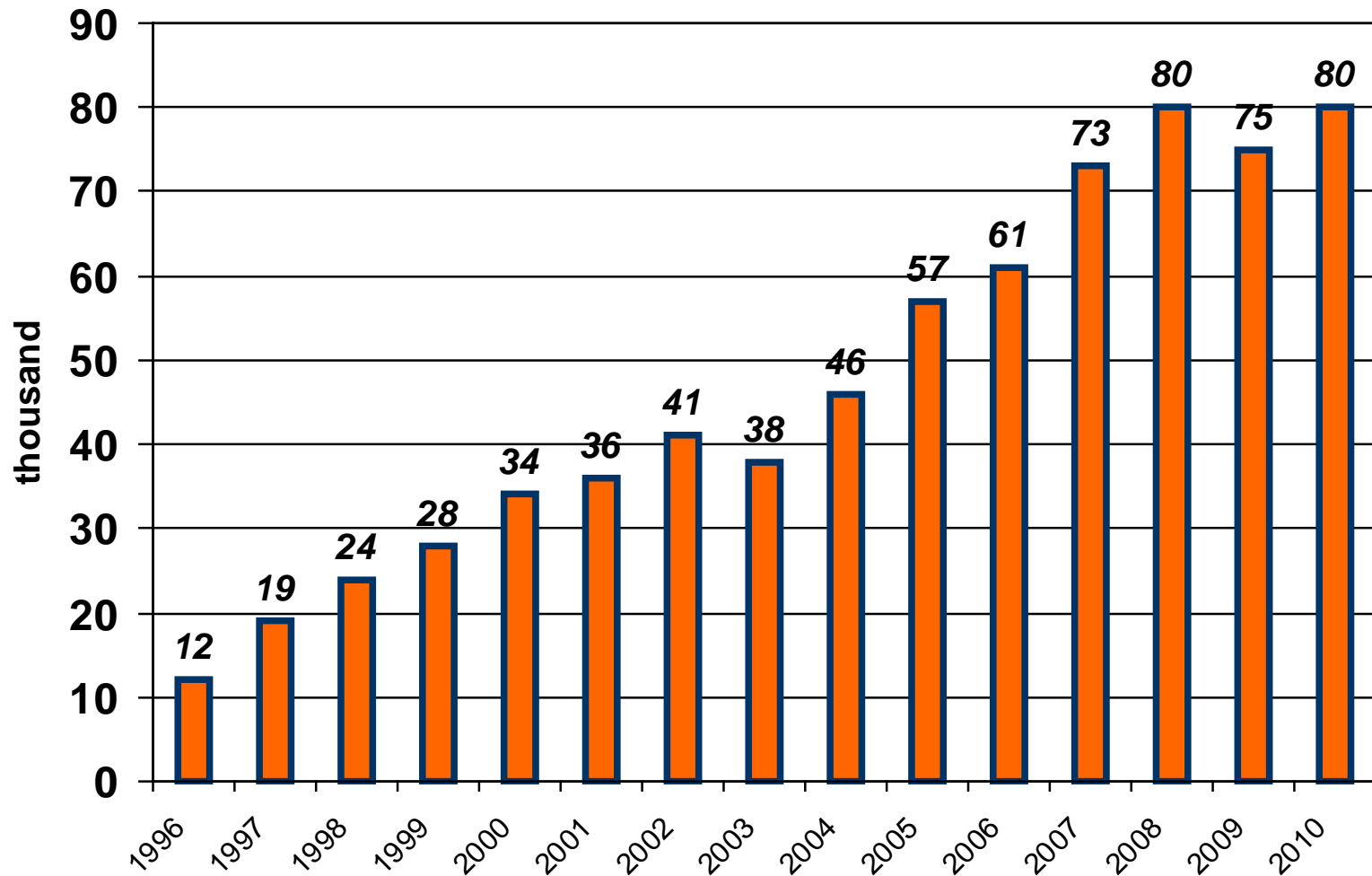
Dynamics of immigration and emigration in Ukraine in 2002-2010 (according to the current statistics)



Number of immigrants and emigrants in Ukraine by countries in 2010

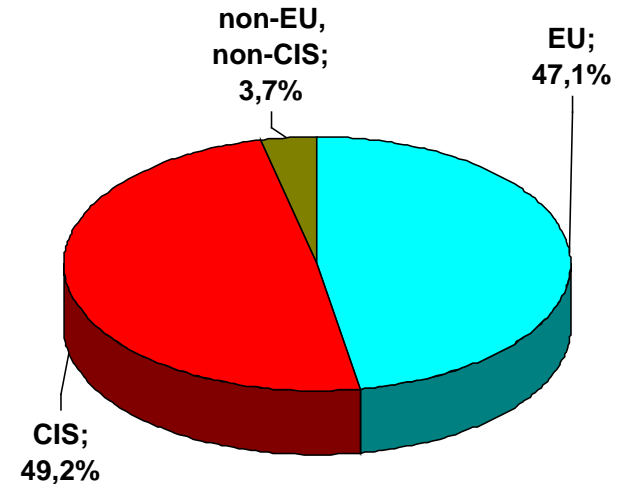
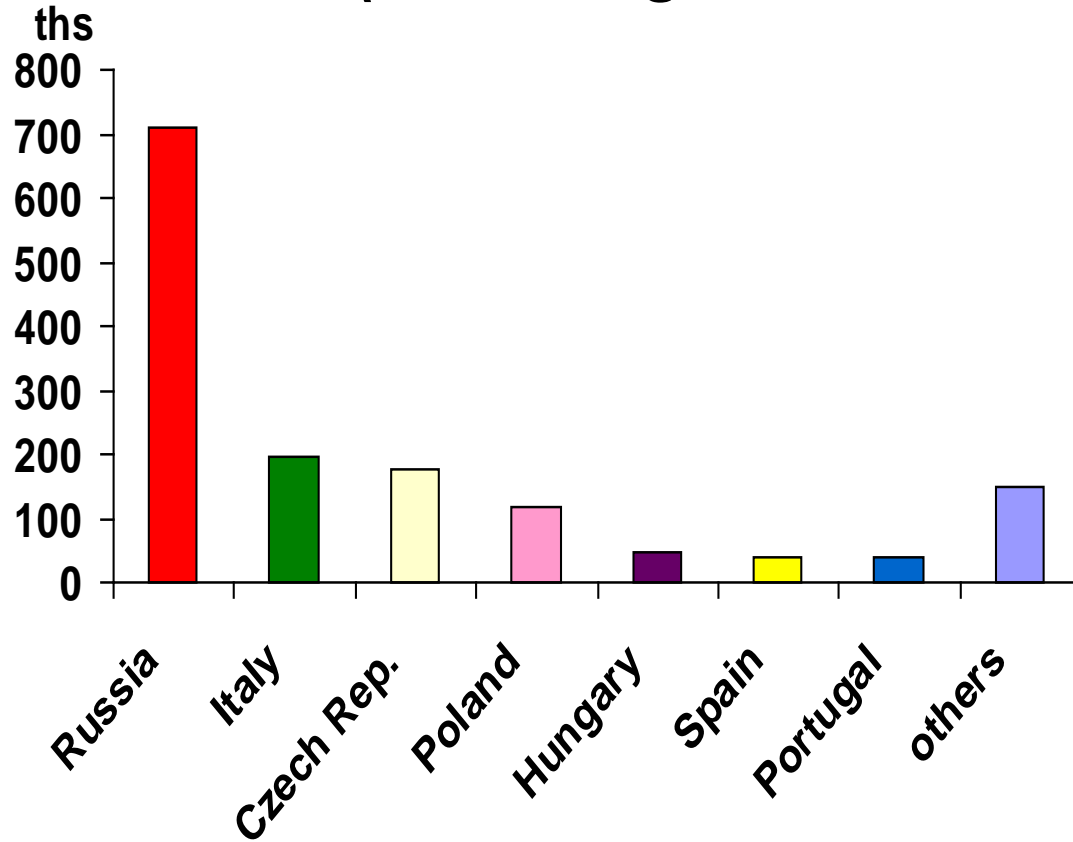


Dynamics of the Number of Ukrainian Citizens, Officially Working Abroad in 1996-2010

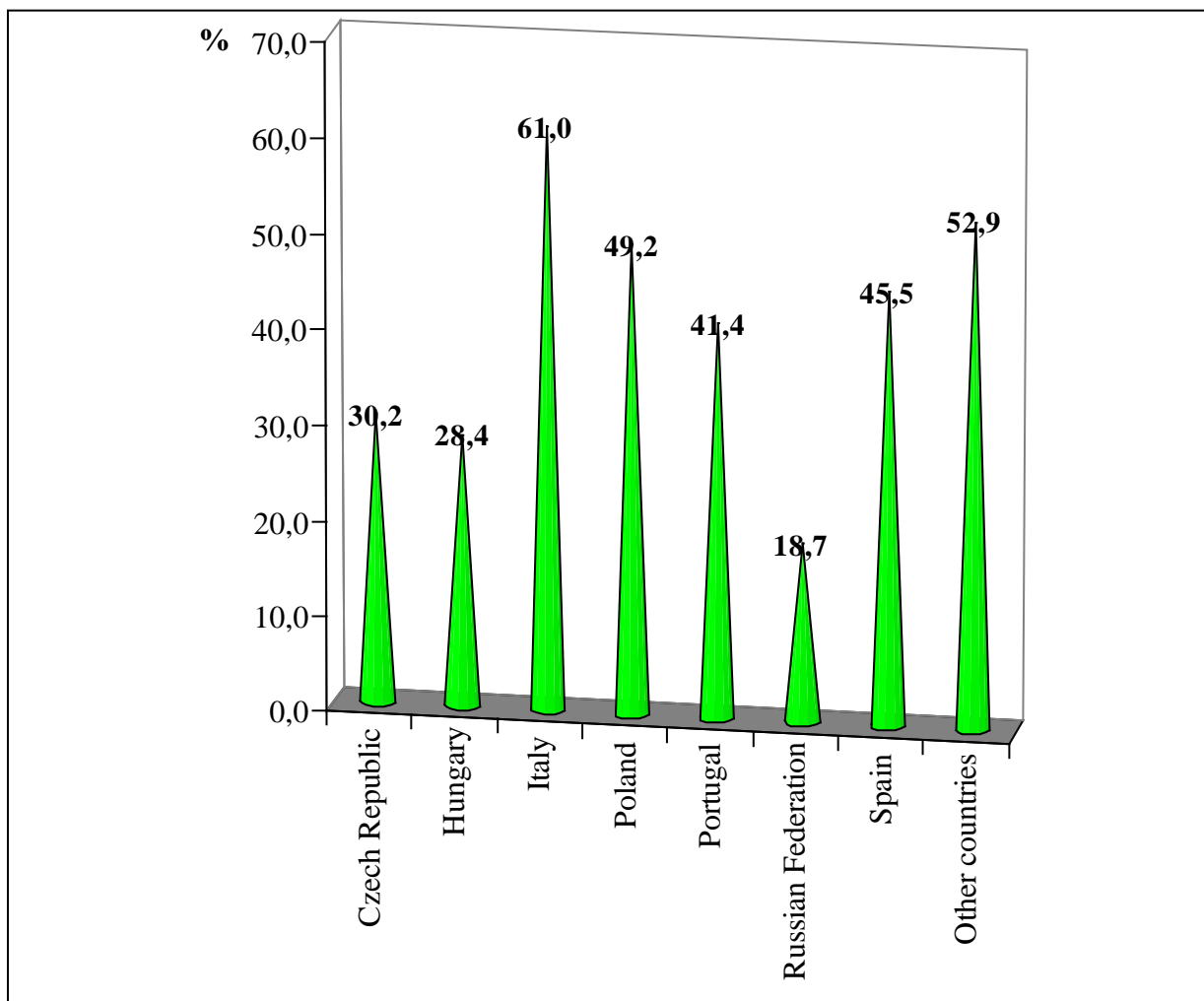


Ukrainian Labour Migrants by Receiving Countries

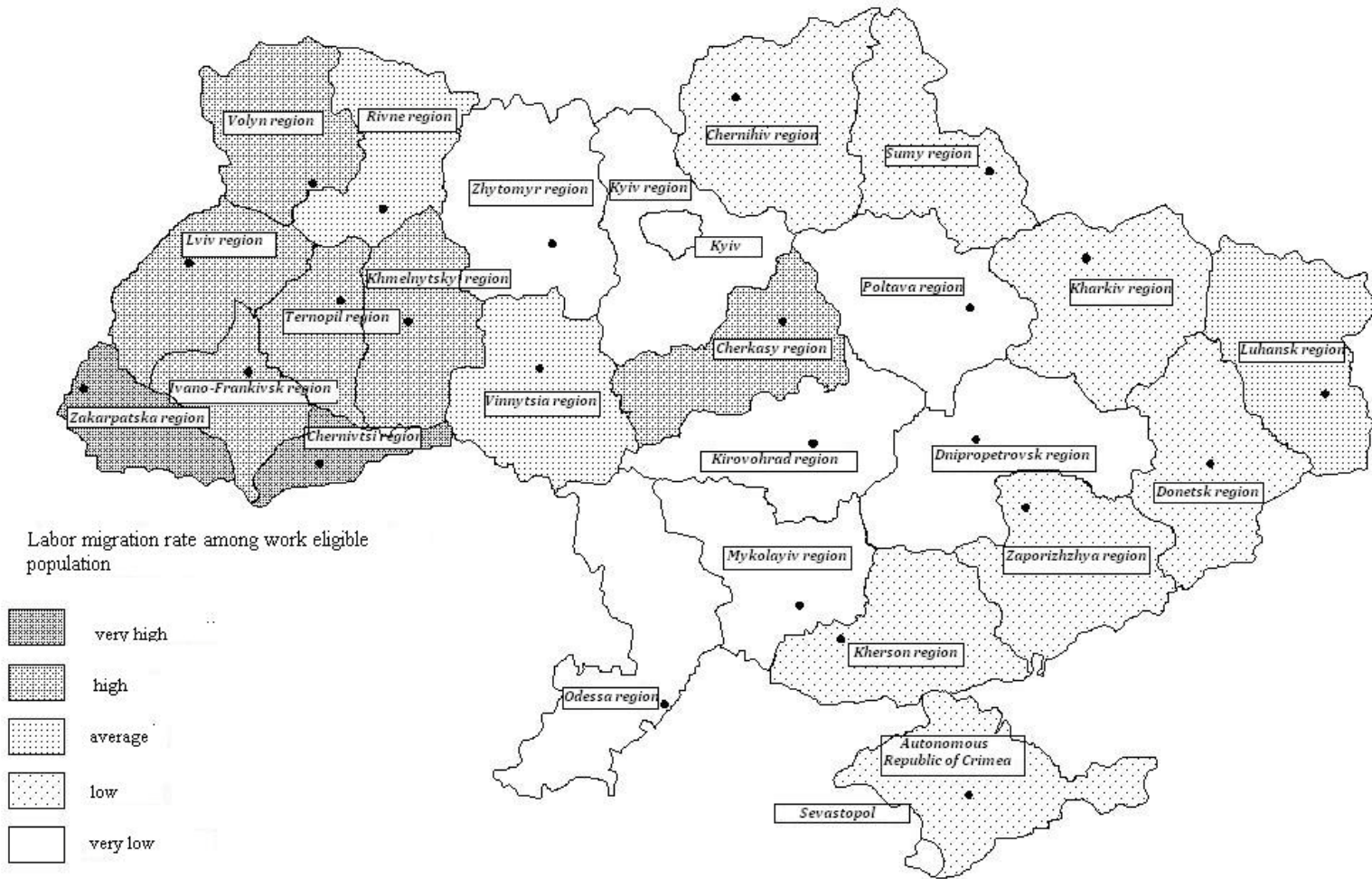

Shares of Women Among Migrants by Countries of Destination



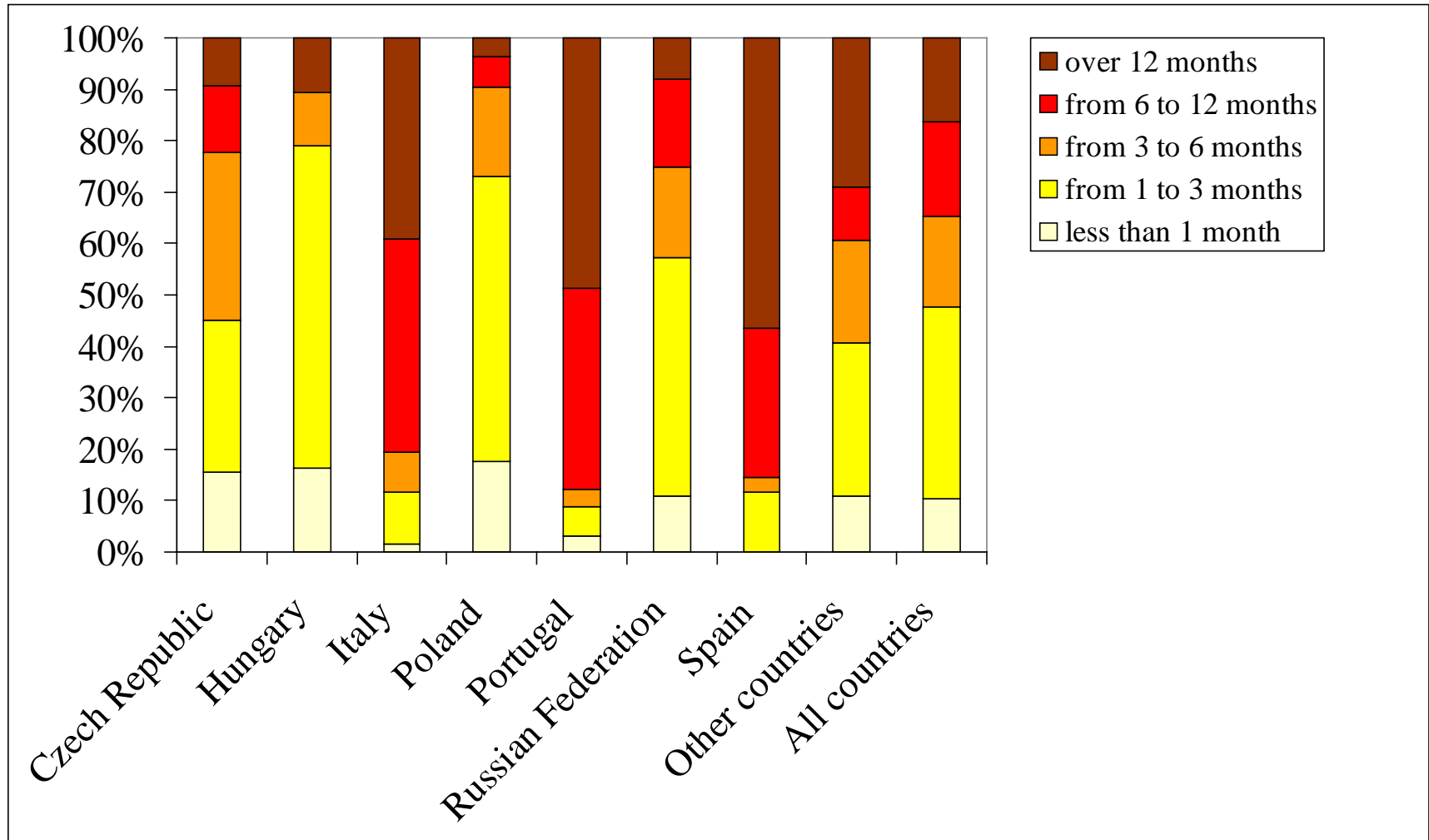
Territorial differentiation in eligible population's participation in labor migration



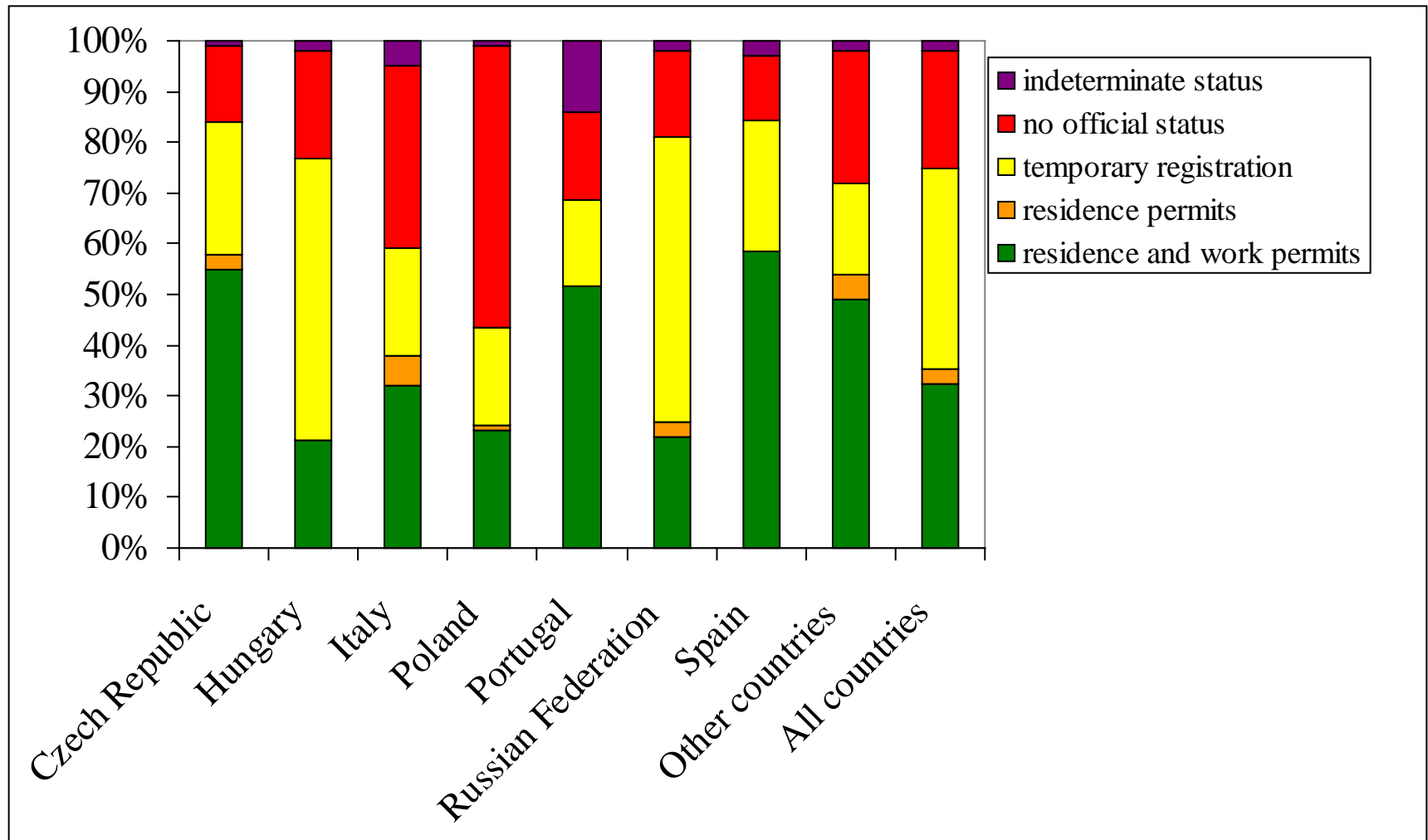
Major factors that define external labor migration rate in the regions are:

- overall level of the regions' development.

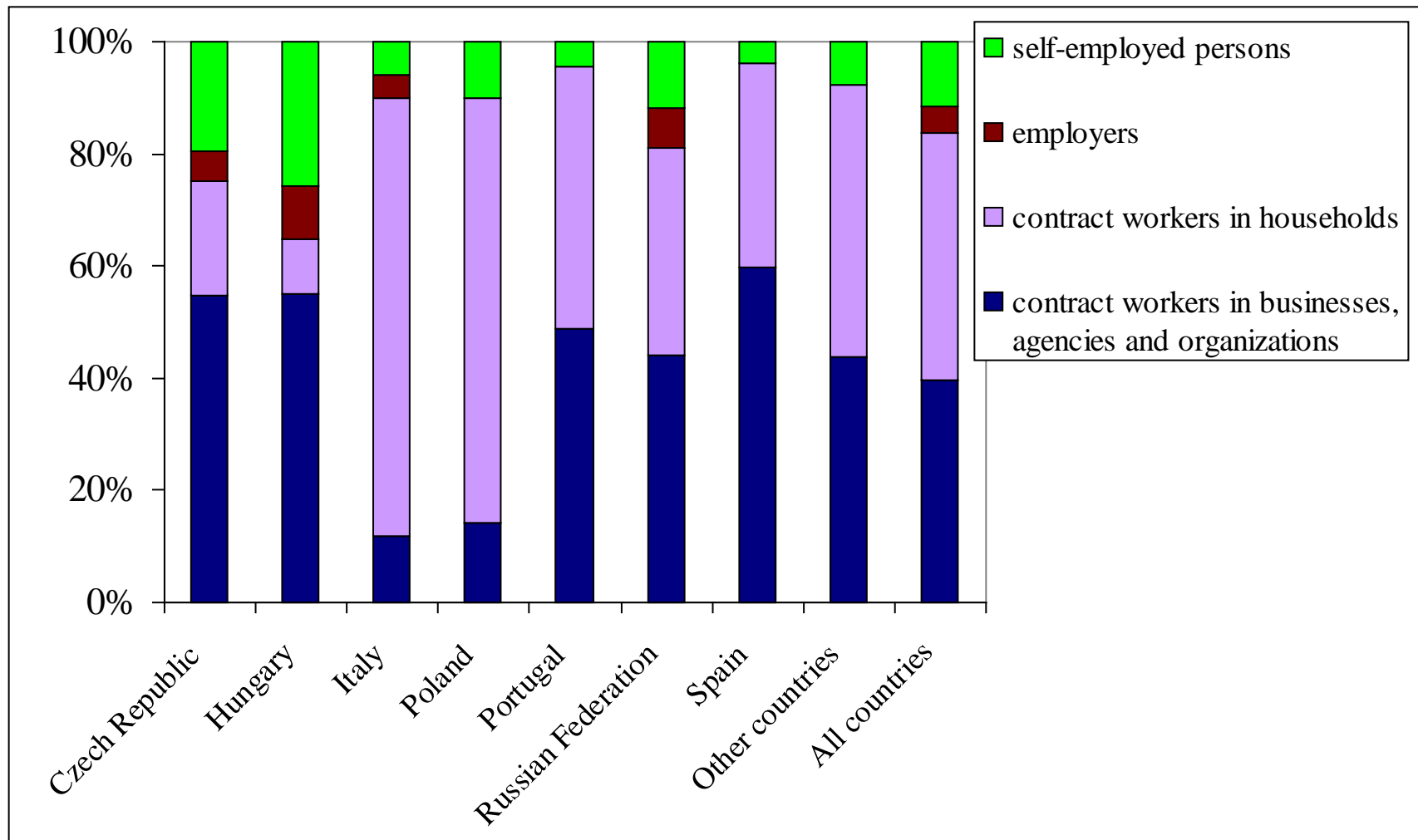
Differentiation of duration of labor migration by countries of migration in 2005 – 2008



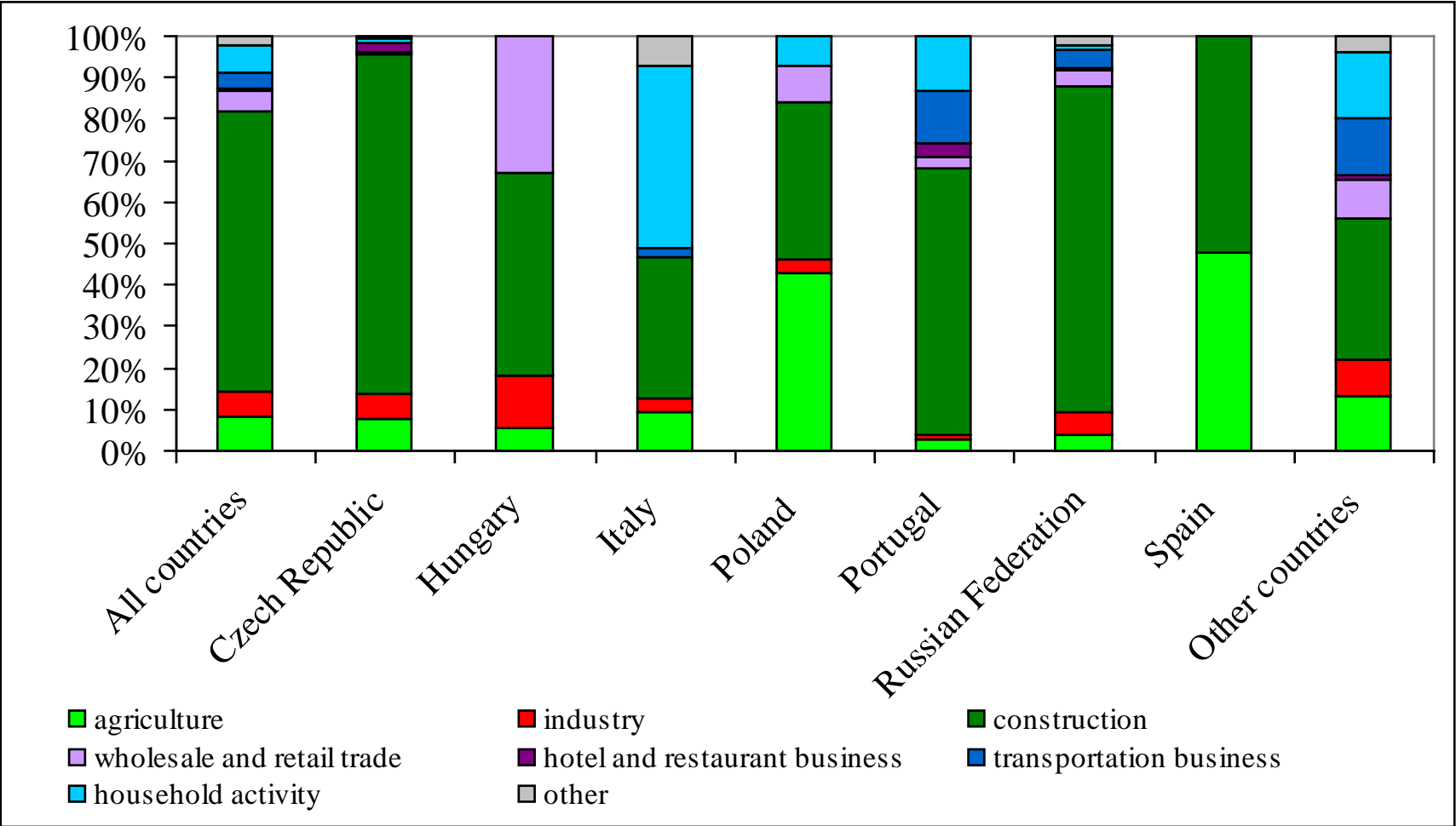
Differentiation of labor migrants by their legal status in the countries of migration, 2007-2008



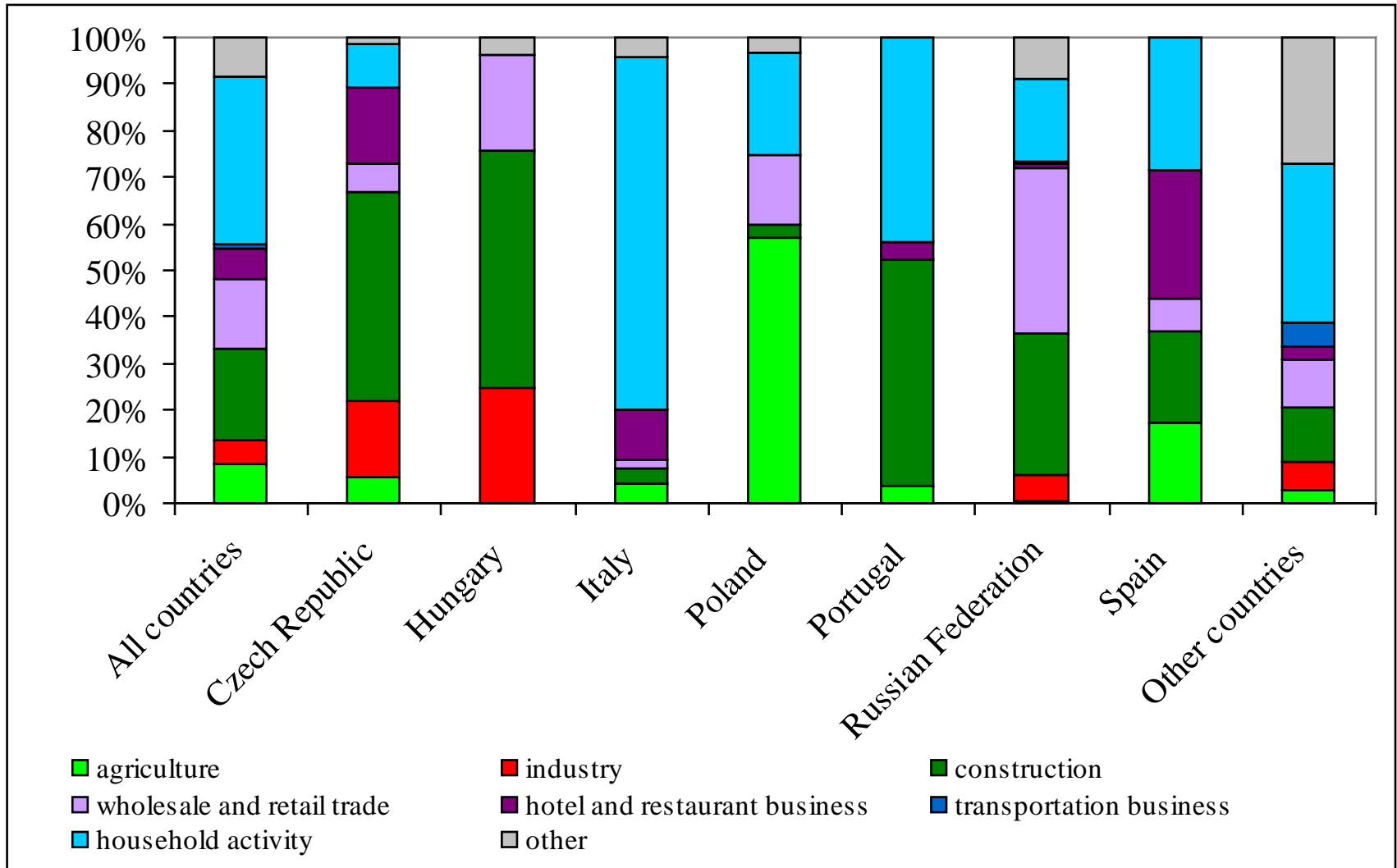
Differentiation of labor migrants by countries of migration and status of employment, 2007-2008
