RESEARCH

My research interests are broadly based, grounded in inter-disciplinarily, and span the disciplines of social work, social and health professions. I have made a significant contribution to policy, practice and theoretical developments in the following broad domains:

1. EVIDENCE-BASED POLICY AND PRACTICE

The development of evidence-based practice in the health and social care professions has been one of the most significant research agendas in the past ten-fifteen years. Of late this has been my most intense area of research activity which has attracted significant research income.

2. WELFARE AND SOCIAL CAPITAL

The theoretical underpinning of welfare by notions of the development of social capital rather than deficit models is of increasing importance in conceptualising the function of welfare which can be linked to social enterprise.

3. APPLIED PROFESSIONAL ETHICS

My work in this field has been mostly theoretical and concerned with the nature of professional ethics and how these can be applied in practice. I have published one of the 'standard' books in this field, which has been widely used in the UK and is of international significance (also translated into Russian and Ukrainian).

4. COMPARATIVE RESEARCH IN SOCIAL WORK

I have an international reputation based on my work in respect of strategic pan-European policy developments, international consultancy, research and development particularly in Eastern Europe. A consistent dimension in my research has been the application of research to practice and policy development.

5. PROFESSIONAL KNOWLEDGE AND EDUCATION

In the field of professional knowledge and education my research has been of international importance (specifically in respect of practice learning/field education) and has made a significant contribution to the academic study of practice learning both within the UK and overseas. The core themes found in recent work concern the way that professionals work within organisations and how they work across organizations making use of their professional knowledge.
